


St. Francis Parish has an email notification system which alerts parishioners to changes/cancellations in scheduling due to inclement weather or other unforeseen events.

Saint of the Week:

Iohn Bosco, Priest

John Bosco (1815-88) was the founder of the society of St. Francis of Sales known as the Salesian order. He is the Patron Saint of Catholic Publishers, editors, and young apprentices.

Born in a small town near Turin, he was brought up in severe poverty. He entered the seminary wearing clothes and shoes obtained through charity and was ordained a priest in 1841 (becoming Don Bosco). Soon thereafter he began a lifelong devotion to educating and caring for boys and young men, especially of Turin.

He served as a time as chaplain to a refuge for young girls, but soon resigned and invited his mother to join him in his apostles to poor and homeless boys. He opened workshops to train shoemakers, trailers, printers, bookbinders, and ironworkers, thereby becoming a pioneer in vocational training. As other priests came to help, the nucleus of a religious community emerged.

With the encouragement of a professor at the Turin seminary, Joseph Cafasso, Don Bosco in 1859 organized a religious community to continue his work. The Salesians were formally approved in 1884. In 1872 he collaborated with Mary Mazzarello to found a parallel community of women, the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians, or the Salesians Sisters.

Upon his death on January 31, 1888, some forty thousand mourners filed past his body as it lay in church, and virtually the whole population in Turin lined the streets for his funeral. He was canonized on Easter Sunday, 1934, by Pope Pius XI, who, as a young priest, had known Don Bosco. On the next day a national holiday in his honor was observed throughout Italy.


